HECOFO's story began in 2022 with a simple idea and a small circle of friends from different universities, united by one shared desire: to make a meaningful difference in the lives of children and youth. I was in my second year at the University of Dar es Salaam, and together we held our first meeting driven by compassion and the belief,



that even small acts of kindness can ignite hope. That meeting marked the beginning of a movement — humble in its start, yet profound in its purpose.

Our first charity was simple: providing school supplies, food, and clothing. Yet, the smiles we saw, the stories we heard, and the hope we witnessed were transformative. They showed us that even the smallest effort can ripple into lasting change. Over time, more friends joined, some left, but a core team held on — committed to the vision, persistent through challenges, and determined to turn a dream into reality.

Through unity, perseverance, and shared purpose, we registered HECOFO as an official NGO. Over the past three years, we have grown into structured initiatives that are already transforming lives. Through Inua Mtoto, we reached over 428 children with school supplies, food, and clothing, and provided 100+girls with sanitary pads. Our mentorship programs have empowered 2,000+students in Lengijave Ward, while Wekeza kwa Vijana has trained and equipped 224+ youths with leadership, entrepreneurship, and life skills. Our MindCare initiative reaches over 5,000 people monthly, spreading mental health awareness and tools for resilience across communities.

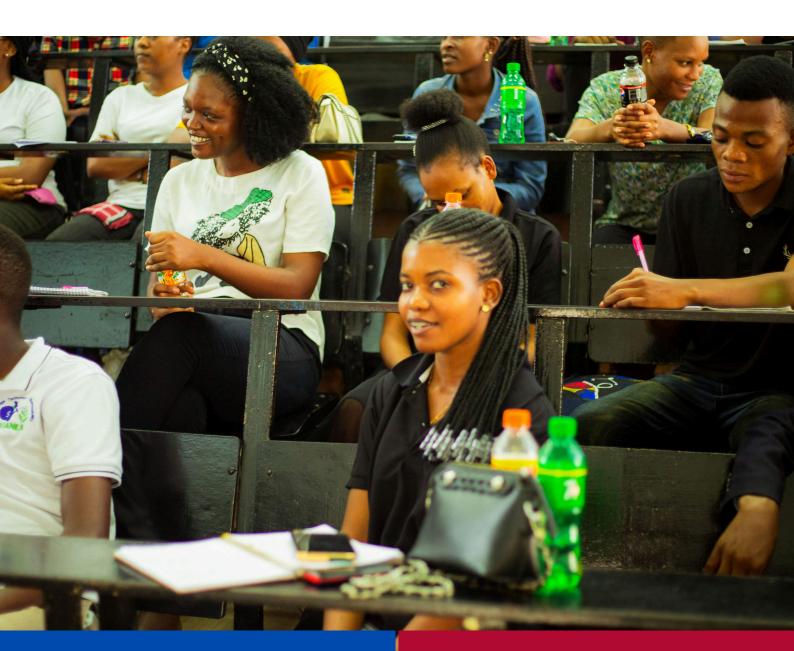

Executive Summary

The period 2022–2025 marks a foundational chapter in the journey of the Hearts of Compassion Foundation (HECOFO) — a youth-led organization born from the conviction that compassion, when put into action, can transform lives and build communities.

What began as a small group of friends inspired by love and purpose has grown into a registered NGO implementing structured programs across two regions of Tanzania — Arusha and Dar es Salaam — touching lives, nurturing potential, and building a movement rooted in empathy, innovation, and community service.

Over the past three years (2022–2025), HECOFO has:

Empowered children through the Inua Mtoto Initiative with school supplies, food, and clothing.

Provided young girls in schools with sanitary pads to promote menstrual health.

Through mentorship programs in Lengijave Ward, students have been motivated to dream big, embrace learning, and take on leadership roles.

Trained youths in leadership, entrepreneurship, and personal development through Wekeza kwa Kijana sessions and symposiums.

Consistently engaged the community via The MindCare Initiative, using digital and local platforms to raise mental health awareness and provide valuable resources.

HECOFO's work has focused on grassroots empowerment, ensuring that vulnerable children and youth, especially those facing economic hardship or social exclusion, gain access to education, mental health support, mentorship, and opportunities. The organization has proven that sustainable transformation begins with compassion and that a generation equipped with love and leadership can rebuild communities from the ground up.

In 2025, HECOFO took a major leap forward by launching its 10-Year Strategic Plan (2025–2035) — a roadmap for growth, sustainability, and impact. This plan formalizes HECOFO's commitment to structured programming, data-driven decision-making, and inclusive development, laying the foundation for scale and deeper engagement.

HECOFO's impact extends beyond numbers, it's reflected in the stories of hope from children who returned to school, youth who discovered purpose, and communities inspired to act compassionately.

Yet, the journey has not been without challenges. Limited resources, staffing capacity, and logistical barriers have tested the organization's resilience. Looking ahead, HECOFO aims to serve over 1,000 beneficiaries annually, establish three new resource distribution programs, and achieve at least 80% positive feedback from beneficiaries across all initiatives. Through the continued support of its Compassionate Crew, individual donors, and strategic partners, HECOFO is poised to expand its reach, scale its programs, and strengthen its voice as a leader in youth-driven community transformation.

Founded in 2022 and officially registered under the Non-Governmental Organizations Act, 2002 of Tanzania (Registration No. 00NGO/R/7568), HECOFO emerged from a shared conviction that small acts of love can lead to profound, lasting change.

Rooted in grassroots communities, HECOFO works to build capacity, create opportunities, and foster inclusion for those who are often left behind — especially children and youth in vulnerable situations, persons living with disabilities, and young people lacking access to education, skills, and psychosocial support.

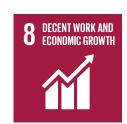

Our Impact (2022–2025)

Between 2022 and 2025, the Hearts of Compassion Foundation (HECOFO) has grown from a small volunteer network into a structured, youth-led NGO reaching thousands of people across Tanzania. Guided by the conviction that compassion is the foundation for transformation, HECOFO has worked hand in hand with communities to empower children, uplift youth, and promote mental wellbeing.

Over the past three years, HECOFO's efforts have reached an estimated 2,500+ individuals, providing direct and indirect support through education, mentorship, upskilling, awareness, and psychosocial interventions. Every activity — from a mentorship session in a classroom to a mental health post shared online — represents a moment of impact and a step toward lasting change.

HECOFO's programs — Inua Mtoto, Wekeza kwa Kijana, and MindCare Initiative — have together created a holistic ecosystem of empowerment, addressing education, skills, and mental health as the pillars of sustainable development. By focusing on grassroots communities, the organization has been able to reach those most in need, build trust with local leaders, and deliver interventions that respond to real challenges.

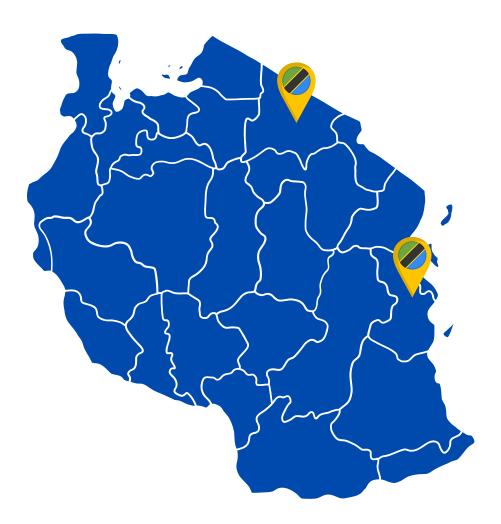


Figure: HECOFO Geographic Footprint: Regions of Operation

1. Inua Mtoto Initiative (Uplift a Child)

Overview & Objectives

The Inua Mtoto Initiative is HECOFO's flagship child empowerment program. It seeks to uplift vulnerable children by meeting their basic educational and wellbeing needs, nurturing hope, and creating opportunities for growth.

Objectives:

- Support vulnerable children with school supplies, food, and clothing.
- Improve school attendance and retention through resource access.
- Promote child rights and inclusivity in education.
- Foster holistic development through mentorship and care.

Strategic Alignment & Future Direction

Inua Mtoto contributes to **Pillar 1: Education & Child Empowerment** of HECOFO's Strategic Plan.

In the next phase (2026–2030), HECOFO plans to:

- Establish Resource Distribution Programs in 3 regions.
- Launch Child Sponsorship & Scholarship Scheme.
- Integrate legal aid and advocacy for child rights and inclusivity.

2. Wekeza kwa Kijana (Invest in Youth)

"Empowering today's youth is investing in tomorrow's Tanzania."

Overview & Objectives

The Wekeza kwa Kijana Initiative is HECOFO's youth empowerment and upskilling program. It aims to equip young people with leadership, entrepreneurship, and life skills — helping them discover purpose, pursue opportunity, and become agents of change.

Objectives:

- Build leadership and entrepreneurial capacity among youth.
- Provide mentorship, training, and career guidance.
- Create platforms for networking and innovation.
- Promote positive mindset, accountability, and productivity.

Case Study: Youth Next Level Digital Symposium

In 2025, HECOFO hosted its first **Youth Next Level Digital Symposium** in Arusha, focusing on digital leadership and personal development. The event equipped participants with digital literacy, communication, and decision-making skills, with 80% reporting improved confidence and goal clarity.

Overview & Objectives

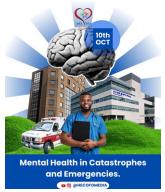
The MindCare Initiative is HECOFO's mental health awareness and wellness program. It champions mental wellbeing through education, digital campaigns, and accessible therapy materials.

What It Is

The **Compassionate Crew** is more than a donor circle — it is a **community of changemakers** who contribute their **time**, **skills**, **or resources** to advance HECOFO's mission. Each member plays a vital role in ensuring that children stay in school, youth gain life-changing skills, and communities receive mental health support.

How It Works

The Crew operates on a shared responsibility model, allowing individuals to engage in ways that match their capacity and passion.

Members contribute through:

- 1. **Timely Donations** Monthly or seasonal contributions that support ongoing projects such as Inua Mtoto and Wekeza kwa Kijana.
- 2.**In-kind Contributions** Donating school supplies, food, clothing, or materials to support children and orphanages.
- 3. **Volunteering** Offering professional skills, mentorship, or time during workshops, symposiums, or field activities.

All contributions are directly tied to programs, ensuring transparency, traceability, and measurable impact.

University Chapters Initiative (2024–2025)

As part of HECOFO's growing movement to nurture compassion, leadership, and youth engagement, the organization established HECOFO University Chapters — dynamic, student-led networks that embody its mission within higher learning institutions.

What began as a small circle of passionate friends has now grown into a vibrant community of over 250 active members across universities in Tanzania. These chapters serve as centers for awareness, volunteerism, and innovation — where young people come together to learn, lead, and serve their communities through HECOFO's values of empathy, empowerment, and action.

Lessons & Learnings (2022–2025)

Over the past three years, HECOFO has learned that impact is not built in haste — it is cultivated through patience, persistence, and partnership. Working with grassroots communities, children, and youth across different regions has revealed valuable insights that continue to shape the Foundation's strategies, structures, and future direction.

These lessons reflect not only organizational growth but also the lived realities of the communities we serve.

1. Institutional Lessons

- 1. Structure Strengthens Sustainability: Building defined systems from leadership roles to budgeting frameworks has proven critical for long-term stability and efficiency. The establishment of HECOFO's 10-Year Strategic Plan (2025–2035) ensures that every project aligns with the broader vision and measurable outcomes.
- 2. Partnerships Multiply Impact: Collaborations with schools, local NGOs, and professionals have expanded HECOFO's reach and credibility. The organization learned that sharing expertise and resources with others accelerates progress and reduces duplication of efforts.
- 3. Digital Platforms are Powerful Tools for Awareness: Through initiatives like MindCare, HECOFO discovered the potential of digital content in reaching thousands with minimal resources. Online engagement has not only raised awareness but also built a national audience around mental health and youth empowerment.
- 4. Financial Sustainability Requires Community Buy-In: The Compassionate Crew Campaign taught HECOFO that localized giving and individual support are more reliable than waiting for large grants. People support what they feel connected to and storytelling strengthens that connection.
- 5.**Leadership and Accountability Drive Growth**: Internal organization, clarity in roles, and consistent communication have been essential in maintaining trust and direction. The team's commitment and faith-driven leadership have become the backbone of every success.

2. Lessons from the Field & Community

- 1. Grassroots Empowerment is the Most Effective Model: Communities respond best to approaches that include them in problem-solving. Programs in Lengijave Ward, Arusha and Temeke, Ubungo, and Kinondoni Districts, Dar es Salaam proved that co-created initiatives produce deeper, longer-lasting impact.
- 2.The establishment of **HECOFO University Chapters** across multiple universities further demonstrated that youth-led, peer-driven engagement is one of the most sustainable models for building empathy, leadership, and long-term community impact.
- 3.**Small Acts Create Big Change:** Even modest interventions such as donating books or offering mentorship create ripple effects that inspire families and communities. The Inua Mtoto initiative showed that hope often begins with one small gesture.
- 4. Holistic Support Yields Greater Results: Children and youth flourish when emotional, educational, and social needs are met together. Integrating mentorship with charity, and mental health with empowerment, amplifies transformation.
- 5. Mental Health Must Be Localized and Accessible: Many young people still face stigma or lack resources for therapy. MindCare's digital model revealed how relatable, local-language communication can normalize conversations about wellbeing.
- 6.**Inclusivity Builds Resilience:** Working with diverse communities taught HECOFO that inclusion across gender, disability, and background not only reflects compassion but strengthens community resilience.

3. Lessons for Partners, Donors & CSOs

- 1. Partnership with Local Actors is Key to Sustainability: Local organizations like HECOFO are closest to the ground realities and investing in them yields greater long-term results.
- 2. Youth-Led Models are Effective Change Catalysts: Young people bring energy, innovation, and authenticity to community development. Empowering youth organizations is essential for scalable social transformation.
- 3. Flexibility and Trust Empower Local Solutions: Donors and partners who provide flexible, trust-based funding enable grassroots organizations to respond faster and more effectively to community needs.

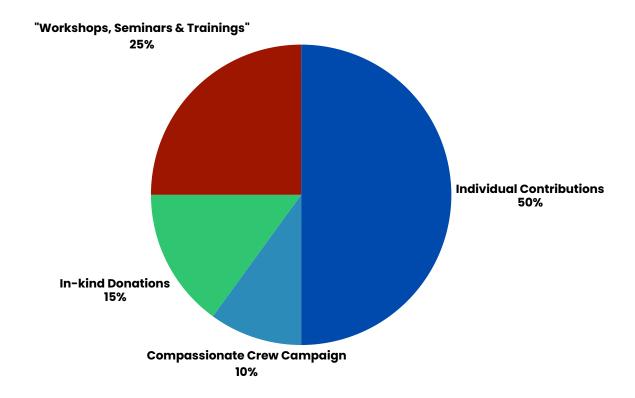
Financial Overview (2022–2025)

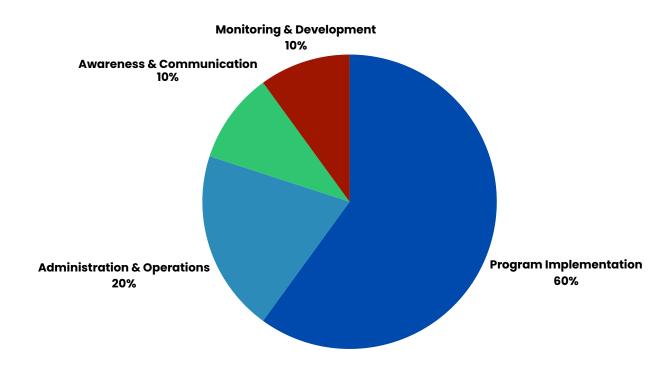

- **Transparency is Key:** Every contribution is tied to a specific program, with regular documentation and reporting shared with donors and supporters.
- **Diversification for Growth**: As the organization expands, HECOFO aims to attract institutional partners and grants to complement its strong grassroots base.

Looking Forward (2026 and Beyond)

HECOFO plans to:

- Strengthen the Compassionate Crew into a structured partner network.
- Develop a digital donation platform for easier and transparent giving.
- Create an annual financial report to improve accountability.
- Explore strategic collaborations with corporate and international donors to scale its impact.

Challenges Faced

As a youth-led and community-based organization, HECOFO's journey from 2022 to 2025 has been marked by both progress and perseverance. Working across diverse contexts — from rural Arusha to urban Dar es Salaam — has revealed a range of challenges that continue to shape the organization's evolution and strategy.

1. Limited Financial Resources

- HECOFO's impact has largely depended on individual and in-kind contributions, with minimal institutional funding.
- The irregularity of donations occasionally slowed project implementation and limited expansion plans.
- The challenge has encouraged creativity and local ownership birthing innovations such as the Compassionate Crew Campaign to ensure sustainability.

2. Institutional Capacity & Human Resources

- As a young organization, HECOFO's small team often carries multiple responsibilities — from field coordination to communications.
- Limited access to long-term staff and professional development opportunities has affected efficiency.
- However, this challenge has strengthened team cohesion and commitment, laying the foundation for future capacity-building investments.

3. Operational Logistics

- Implementing projects across two geographically distant regions Arusha and Dar es Salaam — has created logistical and coordination hurdles.
- Transportation costs, communication gaps, and volunteer management sometimes strain timelines.
- The organization has responded by developing structured planning systems and regional contact networks.

4. Data, Documentation & Impact Measurement

- As a growing NGO, HECOFO is still developing robust tools for data tracking, monitoring, and evaluation (M&E).
- Inconsistent data collection at early stages limited the ability to quantify all impact.
- This has led to the establishment of improved documentation practices and plans to build a digital M&E framework under the Strategic Plan.

5. Mental Health Stigma & Community Perceptions

- While MindCare has reached thousands digitally, addressing mental health in some communities remains sensitive.
- Cultural stigma and misconceptions still hinder open dialogue and access to support.
- HECOFO continues to combat this through awareness campaigns, relatable content, and partnerships with local professionals.

6. Limited Donor and Partner Networks

- The absence of long-term partnerships with funding institutions has limited large-scale expansion.
- However, HECOFO's consistent grassroots impact is gradually attracting the interest of potential collaborators and CSOs.

7. Technological & Infrastructure Limitations

- Limited access to reliable internet and technology in rural project areas restricts digital engagement and follow-up.
- The organization has mitigated this by adopting low-cost, accessible digital communication models.

Turning Challenges into Growth

Despite these challenges, HECOFO has continued to grow steadily – demonstrating that impact is not about abundance of resources, but abundance of purpose.

Each challenge has refined the organization's systems, deepened its understanding of communities, and clarified its priorities for the next phase.

Looking Ahead (2026–2030)

As HECOFO enters the next phase of its 10-Year Strategic Plan (2025–2035), the focus shifts from laying foundations to scaling impact.

The coming years (2026–2030) will center on growth, systems strengthening, and strategic collaboration, all aimed at expanding HECOFO's reach and deepening its transformation across Tanzania.

HECOFO remains steadfast in its mission to empower children and youth — fostering a compassionate generation that leads with empathy, integrity, and innovation.

Recommendations

As HECOFO reflects on its progress from 2022–2025, several lessons and experiences inform the way forward. These recommendations are intended to strengthen internal capacity, enhance program effectiveness, and guide partnerships with stakeholders, donors, and fellow civil society organizations (CSOs).

A. Recommendations for HECOFO (Internal Focus)

1. Institutional Strengthening & Governance

- Continue developing strong internal systems for administration, finance, and program management.
- Formalize standard operating procedures (SOPs) and clear reporting lines for efficiency and accountability.
- Introduce annual staff and volunteer capacity-building sessions to improve leadership and operational excellence.

2. Data, Monitoring & Evaluation

- Develop a simple but effective Monitoring and Evaluation (M&E)
 Framework for tracking outputs and outcomes.
- Integrate digital data collection tools for real-time reporting and impact visualization.
- Publish Annual Impact Summaries to communicate transparency and progress to partners and supporters.

3. Financial Sustainability

- Strengthen and expand the Compassionate Crew Campaign as HECOFO's primary sustainability engine.
- Diversify funding streams through grants, partnerships, and local fundraising events.
- Explore strategic partnerships with corporates for CSR collaborations and sponsorships.

4. Program Expansion & Quality

- Deepen the reach of the three flagship programs Inua Mtoto, Wekeza kwa Kijana, and MindCare — across new regions while maintaining quality.
- Integrate cross-program collaboration for holistic community transformation.
- Establish a Youth Resource & Innovation Hub to consolidate training, mentorship, and mental health services.

5. Visibility & Communication

- Strengthen HECOFO's brand presence through storytelling, impact videos, and digital reports.
- Develop a HECOFO website with a donation portal, gallery, and blog for ongoing updates.
- Engage media partners to document and share impact stories widely.

B. Recommendations for Civil Society, Donors & Partners

1. Invest in Grassroots Organizations

- Local NGOs like HECOFO possess deep contextual understanding and community trust.
- Prioritizing flexible and accessible funding for such organizations leads to sustainable, community-driven outcomes.

2. Support Youth-Led Development

- Youth-led initiatives are often agile, innovative, and cost-effective.
- Investing in them not only creates impact but nurtures the next generation of leaders and change-makers.

3. Encourage Collaboration Over Competition

- Development actors should embrace partnership models that leverage each other's strengths.
- Joint projects, co-funding mechanisms, and shared learning platforms foster greater collective impact.

4. Integrate Mental Health & Wellbeing in Development Agendas

- Every child, youth, and community member needs emotional and psychological support.
- Donors and CSOs should consider mental health as a central part of education, empowerment, and livelihood initiatives.

5. Promote Inclusive and Accessible Development

- Programs should actively engage persons with disabilities and marginalized groups.
- Inclusivity should not be an afterthought, but a design principle for equitable change.
